ABOUT THE ARTIST



Gary Adams was born March 8, 1957 in Owensboro, Kentucky. It was apparent at a very early age that he possessed artistic abilities. As a child, he would spend many hours drawing cartoons from the local newspaper. Over the years, his drawings took on a more realistic quality. All throughout his school years, he excelled in art. In 1975 while a senior at Daviess County High School, he was awarded the "Outstanding Senior Award". He appeared on local TV and was also given a key to the city by the mayor. Gary released his first limited edition art print in 1976. The subject was an old mill located at Falls of Rough, Kentucky. A total of 1,500 copies were sold in just a few months. Since that first release, Gary painted and issued many other subjects, and has sold over 16,000 prints and original paintings.

Artist's note: I highly recommend these brushes. They are very good quality and work very well. If you can't purchase all of them at once, buy them as you are able.

MEDIUMS

I use several different mediums in the painting process. Each one serves a vital function with my painting style and the techniques I employ. Below is a list of what I use on a regular basis in the studio.

Mediums

Fast Dry Gel: I make this using black oil, stand oil and beeswax. I use this to do my block in layer, and to create texture at finish. Allows paint to dry in 1 day. Solvent Free

Slow Dry Gel: I make this using stand oil, safflower oil and beeswax. Allows paint to dry in 3 days. Solvent Free

Fast Dry Liquid: Made by cooking lead powder into linseed oil. It's safe to use if handled properly. I make this medium, also known as black oil. I use this for fine detail work. Allows paint to dry in 1 day or less. Solvent Free

Blending Medium: Used to paint into, over dry paint layer. Also used in glazing techniques.

Oiling Out Medium: Use to restore dull sunken in areas before varnishing. Made using Galkyd medium & Oderless Thinner (NOOD). Made by Utrecht of New York.

Other Essential Items

Safflower Oil: Safflower Oil is a good vehicle for painting with whites and transparent colors. It makes oil colors more fluid, increases their transparency, and has less of a tendency to yellow over time than linseed oil.

Clove Oil: The vapors from this oil, aid in the storing of oil paint.

Galkyd: An alkyd resin painting medium that increases the fluidity of oil colors and speeds their drying time (thin layers will dry within 24 hours).

NOOD Oderless Thinner: NOOD Odorless Paint Thinner is a pure, odorless, slow-evaporating thinner for artists' oil colors and oil mediums. Can also be used in brush cleaning.

PAINTING SUPPORTS

I use several different supports in the painting process. A support is what artists choose to paint on. Each support has it own charachteristics. I encourage new artists to try each and decide what works best for them.

Supports

Stretched Canvas: Cotton duck canvas stretched on kiln-dried wood frames.

Canvas Panels: Cotton canvas, double primed and adhered to an acid-free core. Panels are approximately 1/8" thick. Store canvas panels flat when not in use.

MDF Board: Medium-density fibreboard is an engineered wood product made by breaking down hardwood or softwood residuals into wood fibres, combining it with wax and a resin binder, and forming it into panels by applying high temperature and pressure.

Birch Panel: Baltic Birch Panels are popular with artists because of their firm, smooth surface, neutral color, strength, and affordable cost. The smooth, sanded surface and edges on these Baltic Birch Panels make them ideal for detailed work.

NOTES ON COLOR

Explaining Color

Primary Colors: There are 3 primary colors, yellow, red and blue.

Secondary Colors: There are 3 secondary colors, orange, violet and green. Secondary colors are made by mixing the primary colors.

Orange = Yellow + Red Violet = Red + Blue Green = Blue + Yellow

Hue: Hue refers to the origin of the color we see. Think of the Hue as one of the six Primary and Secondary colors. In other words, the underlying base color of the mixture you're looking at is either Yellow, Orange, Red, Violet, Blue or Green.

Chroma: Is the quality of a color's purity, intensity or saturation. Example: A gray color is a neutral, an extreme low chroma. Fire truck red, is a high chroma red. Brick red is a middle chroma red.

Value: Value is the lightness or darkness of a color or a neutral.

Temp: Temp refers to a color's temperature, cool or warm.

Black: Black is not a color but rather a neutral. It represents the total absense of light.

White: White is not a color but rather a neutral. It represents the total presence of light.

COLORS I USE

Here is a list of my everyday go to colors used in my paintings.

Cadmium Yellow
Yellow Ochre
Burnt Umber
Cadmium Red
Burnt Sienna
Crimson Alizarin (Alizarin Crimson)
Coeruleum (Cerulean Blue)
French Ultramarine Blue
Primary Cyan (Phthalo Blue)
Cadmium Orange Hue
Phthalo Green
Titanium White
Ivory Black

Special Mixes:

Dark Purple: Mix 1 part Crimson Alizarin with 1 part Ivory Black. Use this color to darken all warm colors

Dark Blue: Mix 1 part Phthalo Green with 1 part Crimson Alizarin. When this color is mixed into Titanium White it produces cool blue perfect for painting night scenes.

Dark Brown: Mix 1 part Burnt Umber with 1 part Ivory Black. Use this color to make warm greens when mixed with yellow.
